A-1 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CLOSED SESSION OF THE GLOUCESTER COUNTY BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS TO DISCUSS THE STATUS OF AND POSSIBLE SETTLEMENT OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION MATTERS ENTITLED GEORGE URBAN v. GLOUCESTER COUNTY, C.P. NO. 2009-24239 (INCLUDING UNDERINSURED MOTORIST CLAIM), AND BARRETT JOHNSON v. GLOUCESTER COUNTY, C.P. NO. 2010-18404. (ESRI) FOR THE MAINTENANCE, UPDATES, SOFTWARE LICENSING AND SUBSCRIPTION RENEWAL OF COUNTY COMPUTERS IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$35,000 FROM MAY 2, 2012 TO MAY 1, 2013. Resolution authorizes agreement with ESRI, which is the provider of all GIS Software including ArcMap, ArcInfo, ArcIms (which runs GCMAPS), etc., for County computers covering Emergency Response, Health Department, Land Preservation, Board of Elections, Prosecutor, Planning and Information Technology, but not limited to these departments. Its software and licensing are used exclusively by the State of New Jersey, most counties in New Jersey and many municipalities. There is no substitute software and ESRI is the sole producer of Arc Software. ESRI also provides training services relating to its products and provides technical support through licensing. This contract is for a one year period beginning May 2, 2012 through May 1, 2013 with an amount not to exceed \$35,000.00 pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5(dd).

A-7 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONTRACT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF GLOUCESTER AND APPRAISAL SYSTEMS, INC. TO INCREASE THE TOTAL CONTRACT AMOUNT BY \$17,445.00. B-1 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE EXISTING CONTRACT WITH THE NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT TO INCREASE THE TOTAL CONTRACT AMOUNT BY \$13,581.00. The New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development has forwarded additional federal Workforce Investment Act funds for Program Year 2011 (7/1/11 thru 6/30/12) to the Gloucester County Workforce Investment Board. We received an additional \$5,531 in WIA Adult funding, and an additional \$8,050 in WIA Dislocated Worker funding. The total amount is \$13,581.00. These monies will allow the County to serve eligible County residents in the arena of employment and training. The original NJLWD Workforce Development Area Contract for Program Year 2011 is being modified to reflect these additional monies. The grant period shall be reflected as July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012. The total funding for our County in PY 2011 is \$3,792,601. By executing this amendment the County formally accepts these monies.

B-2 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING JOINT FUNDING AGREEMENT WITH THE UNITED STATES GEOLOGICAL SURVEY IN THE AMOUNT OF \$30,060.00 FROM JUNE 1, 2012 TO MAY 31, 2013 FOR THE INVESTIGATION OF WATER RESOURCES IN GLOUCESTER COUNTY THROUGH THE OPERATION OF ONE STREAM GAGING STATION, AND OPERATION OF WATER LEVEL RECORDERS ON GROUND WATER WELLS. Resolution authorizing a Joint Funding Agreement in the amount of \$30,060 between the County of Gloucester ("County") and the United States Geological Survey ("USGS") for the Investigation of Water Resources in the County, including the operation of one stream gaging station, and operation of water level recorders on ground water wells, for the period June 1, 2012 to May 31, 2013. The stream gaging station was installed in 1988 as part of a Joint Funding Agreement with USGS to measure stream discharge (CFS) at Station Number 0141156 located on Little Ease Run in Clayton. The cost for the ongoing program includes data compilation and computation, data analysis, and publishing the data in the USGS annual water resources publications and CDROM. The information is also accessible through the USGS National Water Information System Web Interface. The stream gaging station provides hydrologic information, hydrographs, and statistics for water supply studies, water resources studies, hydrogeologic studies, flood studies and floodplain mapping, stormwater projects, watershed projects, municipal water supply projects, and Scientific Investigations Reports. The stream gage also provides stream flow data for the USGS National Water Quality

Assessment Projects and Water Supply Availability Project. The agreement also provides for operation of continuous ground water level recorders on four (4) Kirkwood-Cohansey Aquifer wells. Data collected for the project is used for hydrogeologic investigations (water level mapping) and watershed studies. This is part of the ongoing cooperative effort to evaluate the effects of groundwater withdrawals on the Kirkwood-Cohansey Aquifer system. Information from the project is accessible through the USGS National Water Information System Web Interface. The information is also available from the USGS Real Time Hydrologic Notification Systems entitled WaterAlert and StreamMail. The new service enables staff to receive instant streamflow data and groundwater level information.

B-3 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CHANGE ORDER DECREASE #01-FINAL WITH R.E. PIERSON CONSTRUCTION CO., INC. IN THE AMOUNT OF -\$20,954.73 IN REGARD TO ENGINEERING PROJECT 08-10FA. The Resolution will authorize a Contract Change Order Decrease #01-Final with R. E. Pierson Construction Company, Inc. (P.O. Box 430, Woodstown, NJ 08098-0430) for Final "as-built" Quantities, including Supplemental Items, Increases & Decreases, in the amount of -\$20,954.73. This Project entailed resurfacing and safety improvements along Co. Rte.551, Kings Highway / Salem Ave., from 500 +/- feet northeast of Co. Rte. 660, Jessup Rd., to State Highway Rte. 45 in the Township of West Deptford and City of Woodbury. The majority of the project consisted of milling of the existing HMA surface course an average depth of two inches and overlaying the roadway with two inches of Superpave HMA Surface Course. The project also included the installation new long life traffic stripes, raised pavement markers, along with the replacement of existing curb pieces with Eco Type heads, and the installation of bicycle safe grates as needed. Areas of curb replacement were also performed. The existing traffic signal at the intersection of Acme Dr. was also upgraded with new pedestrian facilities. This project is both Federally and State Aid funded, and is a Federal stimulus project No. DHD-4009(101) Construction, Engineering Project #08-10FA.

B-4 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT WITH TECHNA-PRO ELECTRIC, LLC FOR ON-CALL EMERGENCY TRAFFIC SIGNAL REPAIRS FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$324,000.00 FROM MAY 2, 2012 TO MAY 1, 2013, AS PER ENGINEERING BID SPECIFICATION #12-05. The Resolution will authorize the County to enter into a Contract with Techna-Pro Electric, LLC (100 Pike Road, Bldg. B, Mount Laurel, NJ 08054) for on-call emergency traffic signal repairs, which is known as the "Gloucester County Traffic Signal Maintenance Project, Engineering Project #12-05" (hereinafter the "Project"), for a minimum amount of \$0.00, and a maximum amount of \$324,000.00. This contract is proposed to be awarded based upon bids that were publicly received and opened by the County for the Project on Wednesday, April 20, 2012. Techna-Pro Electric, LLC has been determined to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder for the Project. This Project consists of providing traffic signal maintenance on an as needed basis for the County to supplement existing in-house forces. The contractor may be called for services at any time to either work independently, or with County forces on traffic signal and electrical systems.

B-5 RESOLUTION REQUESTING THAT NJDOT DESIGNATE A PORTION OF DELSEA DRIVE, STATE ROUTE 47, FOR BICYCLE LANES IN THE BOROUGHES OF GLASSBORO AND CLAYTON. The Resolution will authorize a Request by the County of Gloucester ("County") to the State of New Jersey Department of Transportation ("NJDOT") to designate a portion of State Route 47, Delsea Drive, be designated for bicycle lanes. The section is located in the Boroughs of Glassboro and Clayton, from the existing multipurpose trail known as Harry Shaw Trail in Glassboro, to Howard and Clinton Avenues in Clayton. The County has constructed bicycle facilities along Fries Mill Road, County Route 655, and the former Conrail Line, in the Boroughs of Glassboro and Clayton, and the Township of Monroe. Further bicycle facilities are under design and planned for construction by the County. The bicycle lanes to be designated along Delsea Drive, State Route 47, would connect the existing and planned bicycle facilities, which would create a looped route beneficial for bicycle and traffic safety, and promote bicycle use within many communities located the County. The NJDOT has requested a formal Resolution from the County in order to begin the process to provide the signing and striping required to designate the bicycle lanes being requested by the County.

B-6 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PURCHASE OF TWO (2) NEW 2012 FORD SUPER DUTY F-250 4WD REGULAR CAB 137" XL VEHICLES WITH OPTIONS FROM DFFLM, LLC FOR USE BY THE GLOUCESTER COUNTY PUBLIC WORKS MOSQUITO CONTROL DIVISION, AND THE PARKS & RECREATION GROUNDS MAINTENANCE DIVISION, FOR THE LUMP SUM AMOUNT OF \$51,292.00, AS PER BID PD 012-009. Resolution authorizing the purchase of two (2) new 2012 Ford Super Duty F-250 4WD Regular Cab 137" XL vehicles with options from DFFLM, LLC for use by Gloucester County Public Works Mosquito Control Division, and Parks & Recreation Grounds Maintenance Division, for the lump sum amount of \$51,292.00, as per Bid PD-012-009. DFFLM, LLC was determined to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder to deliver the vehicles in question.

B-7 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE DELAWARE VALLEY REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2012 CONGESTION MITIGATION AND AIR QUALITY CONTROL GRANT FUNDING TO PURCHASE COMPRESSED NATURAL GAS TRANSPORT VANS. The Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission ("DVRPC") has funding available for fiscal year 2012 through its Congestion Mitigation Air Quality Control ("CMAQ") grant program. The grant funding from the CMAQ grant program can be utilized for the purchase of Compressed Natural Gas ("CNG") Transport Vans which the County of Gloucester's ("County") Division of Transportation Services Senior Citizen Transport Program require to replace older vans. All applications to the CMAQ grant program need to be submitted by May 14, 2012. CMAQ grants fund up to 80% of total project costs, so the County would be responsible for a 20% match commitment. DVRPC confirms that there is \$2.6 Million of CMAQ funding available for New Jersey projects. This grant would help offset the cost of the County's purchase of transport vehicles, and will also help the County achieve

emissions reductions by using CNG vehicles. If the CMAQ grant is awarded, the County will be able to replace up to two (2) vehicles that are at the end of their life, no longer meet federal recommended emissions standards. The County's grant application will seek \$200,000.00 of funding; so the County will be required to commit to a \$40,000.00 match.

B-8 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF ONE (1) USED 2011 VOLVO ECR 235CL SHORT RADIUS TAILSWING HYDRAULIC EXCAVATOR WITH QUICK COUPLER FROM PENN JERSEY MACHINERY FOR USE BY THE COUNTY OF GLOUCESTER'S DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS FOR THE LUMP SUM AMOUNT OF \$165,000.00, AS PER BID PD-012-007. Resolution authorizing the purchase of one (1) used 2011 Volvo ECR 235cl short radius tail swing hydraulic excavator with quick coupler from Penn Jersey Machinery for use by the County of Gloucester's Department of Public Works for the lump sum amount of \$165,000.00, as per bid PD-012-007. Penn Jersey Machinery was determined to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder to deliver the equipment in question.

B-9 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT WITH CME ASSOCIATES FOR CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT AND INSPECTION SERVICES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$65,834.50, AS PER RFP-12-027, FOR ENGINEERING PROJECT #11-03FA. The resolution will authorize a Professional Services Contract, per RFP-12-027, with CME Associates, Consulting & Municipal Engineers (2141 Bordentown Avenue, Parlin, NJ 08859-1162) for Construction Management & Inspections Services required for County Road Improvement Project known as "Resurfacing and Safety Improvements to Buck Road (CR553) from 1000' N. of Clayton Avenue (CR608) to the Salem County Line in the Townships of Elk & Franklin, Gloucester County," Federal Project #STP-0144(109) Engineering Project #11-03FA (hereinafter the "Project") in the amount of \$65,834.50. This Project consists of the milling and resurfacing with 2-1/2" of HMA surface course Buck Road CR553, from Salem/Gloucester County line to Thornwood Drive in the Townships of Franklin and Elk. The project will also include the installation of a new traffic signal at the intersection of CR553 and CR608; upgrades to the existing traffic signal at the intersection of CR538; the replacement of parapet walls at Bridge 9-J-1; installation of new long life traffic stripes; raised pavement markers; guide rail upgrades; along with the resetting/replacement of existing signs. The project is anticipated to be completed 60 days after issuance of a notice to proceed. This project is 100% Federally Funded.

E-1 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF SOFTWARE MAINTENANCE AND ADMINISTRATION CONTRACT WITH UNION ORGANIZATION FOR SOCIAL SERVICES/COMMUNITY INFORMATION SYSTEMS (UOSS) FOR THE COUNTY OF GLOUCESTER, FOR A MINIMUM CONTRACT AMOUNT OF ZERO AND A MAXIMUM CONTRACT AMOUNT OF \$23,000.00, FROM MAY 22, 2012 TO MAY 21, 2013. The County of Gloucester has determined that there is a need to continue to provide Gloucester County's social services "No Wrong Door" information system, as provided by Union Organization for Social Services / Community Information Systems (UOSS). This resolution is to authorize the execution of software maintenance and administration contract with Union for Social Services / Community Information Systems (UOSS) for a minimum contract amount of Zero and a maximum contract amount of \$23,000.00, from May 22, 2012 to May 21, 2013.

E-2 RESOLUTION TO REMOVE VEHICLE #CS 638 FROM NJ TRANSIT INVENTORY TO THE SOLE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE COUNTY OF GLOUCESTER. NJ Transit is retiring a 2006 Ford Minibus, Vehicle #CS 638, currently leased to Gloucester County and is offering to transfer the vehicle to the County of Gloucester. The County of Gloucester is accepting ownership of this bus from NJ Transit to continue to operate the vehicle to service elderly and disabled residents. The execution of this resolution will formally authorize the transfer of this vehicle, NJT CS-638 - DTS #72, a 2006 Ford Bus w/lift originally procured by NJ Transit with Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5316 JARC grant funds. Upon transfer of ownership of the vehicle, the County of Gloucester will continue to operate the vehicle.

F-1 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT FROM MAY 1, 2012 TO APRIL 30, 2019 BETWEEN THE COUNTIES OF GLOUCESTER AND CUMBERLAND TO PROVIDE HOUSING ON AN AS NEEDED BASIS FOR GLOUCESTER COUNTY FEMALE INMATES IN THE CUMBERLAND COUNTY CORRECTIONAL FACILITY. This Resolution authorizes the execution of a Shared Services Agreement between Gloucester County and Cumberland County wherein Cumberland County houses Gloucester County's female detainees and offenders. This Resolution authorizes the

Agreement to cover the period May 1, 2012 to April 30, 2019. The cost of housing the female inmates shall be as follows: From the period commencing May 1, 2012 at a per diem fee for each housed female inmate in the amount of One hundred twenty-five (\$125.00) dollars per day through April 30, 2015; One hundred thirty-five (\$135.00) dollars per day from May 1, 2015 through April 30, 2017; and One hundred forty-five (\$145.00) dollars per day from May 1, 2017 through April 30, 2019.

F-2 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF ANY AND ALL DOCUMENTS, CERTIFICATIONS AND REPORTS TO OBTAIN AND EXPEND CONTINUATION FUNDING FROM THE NEW JERSEY DIVISION OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC SAFETY FOR THE COMPREHENSIVE TRAFFIC SAFETY PROGRAM (CTSP) THROUGH THE GLOUCESTER COUNTY PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE, FROM OCTOBER 1, 2012 TO SEPTEMBER 30, 2013, IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$58,450.00. The Gloucester County Highway Safety Taskforce is dedicated to reducing the number of serious and fatal motor vehicle accidents that occur in our county. The taskforce is a public/private partnership involving community, governments and business leaders. The Gloucester County Highway Safety Taskforce seeks to increase public awareness of the significant safety problems confronting our residents through education, communication and training. This grant will provide the tenth year of funding for this project. Past grant funding has purchased items such as crash data retrieval systems that are used at the scene of a fatal accident, traffic data collection device which allows municipal law enforcement agencies to document and identify new driver trends and analyze why it is occurring, child safety seats, blood/urine kits for use involving DUI cases, traffic safety pre-printed educational materials. The grant also pays for the instructor fees for the following courses: Crash Investigation I & II, GPS Forensic Investigations, Traffic Crash Reconstruction, and Advanced Commercial Vehicle Crash Investigations hosted at the Gloucester County Police Academy for patrol officers and training/conferences/workshops for Gloucester County Highway Safety Taskforce personnel to enhance knowledge of latest technology and safety programs. This year's funding will continue to fund traffic safety education materials including Defensive Driving course workbooks and videos, instructor fees at the police academy for traffic crash courses for local patrol officers, training/conference/workshops, such as Lifesavers Conference, and Crash Data Retrieval for task force personnel, website hosting fees for www.gcsaferoads.org, blood/urine kits for DUI cases and road/traffic safety supplies.

F-3 RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF ANY AND ALL DOCUMENTS RELATIVE TO THE EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG) PROGRAM, #JAG 3-5-09, IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$75,000.00, FROM APRIL 2, 2012 TO APRIL 1, 2013. The 2012-2013 Community Justice Grant will further the work of the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office in bridging the gap between law enforcement and the community especially the youth within the community while also working to improve public safety and better the quality of life of the residents of Gloucester County with a special attention on the four highest crime areas within the county. The Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office has developed a county-wide initiative, Gloucester County Community Partnership that addresses the needs and quality of life issues as brought forward by municipality representatives consisting of community leaders as well as resident volunteers. The grant will also allow the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office to extend its youth outreach efforts by funding crime prevention and intervention programs through educational opportunities, direct contact, literature and handouts, developing tolerance programming for court involved juveniles who have displayed disruptive hate and intolerance towards others in their community and continuing our anti-gang partnership consisting of juvenile detectives and school resource officers. This year through the Community Justice Partnership Anti-Bullying Campaign will continue activities to include poster contests for elementary schools, original written works for middle schools and a video contest for high schools with this funding covering the costs of supplies, trophies and certificates. Funding will offer twenty five high school students from area schools within the targeted at risk neighborhoods the opportunity to participate and successfully complete the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office Summer Youth Internship Program. This program will familiarize the students with the inner workings of the criminal justice system. Students spend two weeks at the police academy and two weeks at the Prosecutor's office. Students will be provided lunch and transportation daily, four field trips and receive a \$100 per week stipend upon successfully completing the program at the graduation ceremony with parents attending. Grant resources will purchase office supplies, postage, t-shirts, and gym bags for programs. This grant will also cover the salary of the Community Justice Coordinator and a summer intern for seven weeks to assist with the Summer Youth Program. With regard to the Coordinator and Project Director the grant will cover mileage reimbursement to events, training and the cost incurred annually for their cell phones.
