MAKING HISTORY IN YOUR BACKYARD

Gloucester County's county college, Rowan College of South Jersey, and Rowan University announce Veterinary School

The Rowan University School of Veterinary Medicine will be housed on the campus of Rowan College of South Jersey (RCSJ), the first in the state.

Rowan will establish undergraduate, graduate, doctoral, and internship/residency programs at the veterinary school. Additionally, an A.S. in veterinary technology to B.S. in veterinary technology pathway program will be offered in collaboration with Rowan College of South Jersey-Gloucester. Rowan University will become one of two

universities in the nation to offer Doctor of Veterinary Medicine, Doctor of Medicine, and Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine degrees.

"We believe the partnership between the County, Rowan University, and Rowan College of South Jersey creates a unique opportunity for students. We continue to create ways for our students to excel in future career paths thanks to the growing landscape of the county, all while keeping education affordable," said Commissioner Lyman Barnes, Liaison to Education.

Veterans: Did you know there's income tax exemption for Veterans? Under legislation passed by former Senate President Steve Sweeney, you are eligible for a \$6,000 exemption (\$3,000 for Tax Years 2017 and 2018) on your New Jersey Income Tax return if you are a military veteran who was honorably discharged or released under honorable circumstances from active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States on or any time before the last day of the tax year. Your spouse (or civil union partner) is also eligible for an exemption if they are a veteran who was honorably discharged or released under honorable circumstances and you are filing a joint return. **For more information, please call 609-292-6400**

The Gloucester County Office of Emergency Management works collaboratively with the State to assist you. The Registry is designed to assist emergency responders in locating those residents that may need assistance evacuating in an emergency and who lack adequate assistance from

families and caregivers. You (or someone on your behalf) should register if you may find it difficult to get to safety with family or friends or to a public shelter during an emergency evacuation because of a physical or cognitive disability, communication barrier, or lack of transportation.

The Nutrition Program provides a well-balanced mid-day meal to seniors who are 60 or older or the spouse of a participant. The mid-day meal is served Monday through Friday at the Nutrition Sites listed. In addition to a meal, the sites also foster social inter-

action, and offer recreational and leisure activities as well as providing access to other supportive services available to Gloucester County senior citizens. Meals are planned by a nutritionist to ensure the recommended nutrients.

Serv-a-Tray is our home-delivered meal program designed to maintain health through proper nutrition and enable homebound seniors to remain in the community with independence and dignity. To be eligible, persons must be age 60 or older; homebound;

unable to shop or prepare their own meals; have no one to assist with meals; and be on a regular diet. A complete midday meal is delivered to participants Monday through Friday and frozen meals are available for the weekends.

Seniors- Apply for Property Tax Relief

Under the Homestead Benefit program, eligible homeowners receive a credit against their local property taxes. The Senior Freeze Program, established by former Senate President Steve Sweeney, is available to residents over 65 years of age who meet certain income eligibility standards, or residents receiving Federal Social Security benefits. Eligible Senior Freeze applicants receive a check for the difference between their current property taxes and the

property taxes paid on their first year of eligibility in the program. The Senior Freeze Hotline is 1-800-882-6597, and the Homestead Benefit Hotline can be reached at 1-888-238-1233. GRANT AWARDED TO EXPAND OPEN SPACE PLAN

Gloucester County has received a \$1,000,000 Green Acres matching grant from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and the Garden State Preservation.

This grant will be used to fund the Gloucester County Open Space Preservation Program and the Farmland Preservation Program. The objective of the Open Space

Preservation Program is to expand the existing county and municipal park system in Gloucester County. Through this program the county has been able to expand all three county parks: Red Bank Battlefield, the James G. Atkinson Park and the Scotland Run Park along with five additions of lands adjacent to the County golf course and greenway in Mantua Township.

Gloucester County Animal Control Rescues Bald Eagle

The Gloucester County Animal Control Division received a call on Saturday, December 11 in South Harrison Township regarding a sick or injured Bald Eagle.

Animal Control arrived at the scene and immediately contacted Elk Fire Department and Mullica Hill Fire Department for ladder assistance. The bald eagle was taken to Tri-State Bird Rescue and Research for further testing and review.

"We want to remind residents the importance of animal safety. If you see an animal that you believe needs care, do not ever approach the animal. Always call Animal Control for the experts to do their jobs," said Director Frank J. DiMarco. "It's best to contact experts so no one gets hurt- including the animals."
