HIGHLIGHTING GLOUCESTER COUNTY EMS

The Gloucester County Emergency Medical Service is the first county-based Emergency Medical Service (EMS) in New Jersey, established on September 30, 2007.

GCEMS is a dedicated organization of professionals with the highest standards for quality and excellence. GCEMS is committed to providing dependable, professional emergency medical service to all residents and visitors of Gloucester County.

GCEMS is passionate about monthly continuing education opportunities for staff and the public. GCEMS holds monthly EMT refresher lessons and free CPR training and partners with Rowan University to hold the Clinical Education Symposium annually.

At the June 2022 Symposium, Commissioner Denice DiCarlo honored Gloucester County EMS Chief Andy Lovell and Rowan EMS Assistant Chief Maribeth Novsak with a proclamation for the tenth anniversary of the Clinical Education Symposium. The Clinical Education Symposium is a collaboration between Gloucester County EMS, and Rowan University EMS which provides free continuing education units to EMTs and Paramedics.

GCEMS also sponsors the "Vial/File of Life Program," which allows individuals to provide medical information in advance that GCEMS crews can use in the case of an emergency. The

program consists of obtaining a red magnet for a "File of Life." The file contains a medical form that has been filled out stating the health status of the individual and current medications.

The File of Life kit can be obtained from any GCEMS crew or station, the Gloucester County administrative offices in Woodbury, or the GCEMS office in Clayton. Please call the GCEMS office at (856) 307-7120 for assistance or any questions.

GIVE BACK TO YOUR COMMUNITY

Gloucester County Improvement Authority awards mini-grants to non-profit organizations through the Clean Communities Program.

Only young adults and adults can participate in the Adopt-a-Road sites and clean the County Highways. Our program also allows grades K-8 to participate in an Adopt-a-Spot, which gives our children a chance to gain "ownership" on their school grounds. To adopt an area, you must commit to two years. The county will provide the necessary safety equipment to clean the chosen locations.

All non-profit organizations are eligible upon submitting your application. You must supply our office with your non-profit organization number and proof of insurance.

WIC SERVICES AVAILABLE

Gloucester County WIC is a Supplemental Nutrition Program that provides healthy food, nutrition and breastfeeding education, health screening, and referrals to community health and social service programs.

In the event of a public health emergency, volunteers are our most valuable resource.

The mission of the Gloucester County Medical Reserve Corp (GCMRC) is to improve the health and safety of communities by organizing and utilizing public health, medical, and other volunteers. The GCMRC's goal is to enhance the community's emergency preparedness by ensuring that a trained group of healthcare professionals and community volunteers are ready to respond to public health emergencies. Licensed/certified healthcare professionals, practicing/retired, living/working in Gloucester County are needed. Any community members interested in health issues can volunteer (interpreters, chaplains, social workers, etc.). Duties might include direct patient care, administrative/secretarial duties, and translation/reception duties.

Volunteers are required to participate in training and education in order to be adequately prepared should an event occur. They must perform duties in accord to their interests, training, and experience. We provide FREE TRAINING to our volunteers to ensure support for our local health agencies for any public emergency for our local health agencies when called upon.

FIGHT THE SPOTTED LANTERNFLY!

The Gloucester County Public Works Department has received a grant for Spotted Lanternfly Control in Gloucester County! Our control program involves spraying during the spring, summer, and fall months. We will be using our truck-mounted Mist Blower to treat infestations of larvae and adults using an NJ-DEP-approved insecticide. We will also be treating county and municipal properties and identifying areas of mass infestations along county roadways. We have coordinated our efforts with state and federal control officials. We have jointly developed a plan to control the Lantern Fly.

TOWN SPOTLIGHT: GREENWICH

For our town spotlight this month, we are talking about Greenwich Township, often referred to as Gibbstown. Home to the oldest log cabin in America, Nothnagle Cabin, this Swedish-constructed home built in the 1600s is on the National Register of Historic Places and proudly represents a unique history for the town and those passing through.

With just 4,800 residents, Greenwich is a unique place with a small-town feel. It has plenty of recreation areas and open spaces for residents of all ages to enjoy. Memorial Park is a location for many events, including an upcoming Dinner & Dancing Night with live music in the park on July 22nd from 5-9 pm. The Gibbstown Sports Complex is also undergoing renovations, such as installing new playground equipment compliant with ADA standards to ensure all children can play.

Located thirty minutes from Philadelphia and Wilmington, only two hours from New York City, and conveniently near major highways, this Gloucester County town has easy access to many regional attractions and still provides a family-friendly community. As a result, it has earned its slogan, “We’re on your way to everywhere!”

Emergency Rental Assistance



PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Gloucester County has received funds from the U.S. Department of Treasury to provide rental relief to landlords and tenants through the Emergency Rental and Utility Assistance Program (ERAP). Gloucester County will provide rental households financial assistance for unpaid rent* and/or utility bills due to impact of COVID-19.

An eligible household may receive up to twelve (12) months of assistance (plus an additional three (3) months if necessary to ensure housing stability for the household, subject to the availability of funds, but not to exceed 18 months total assistance).

*Fair Market Rents will be applied for certain eligible households.

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

Selected households must meet the following eligibility criteria to qualify for assistance:

- Qualify for unemployment or have experienced a reduction in household income, incurred significant costs, or experienced a financial hardship due, **directly or indirectly**, to the COVID-19 pandemic
- Demonstrate a risk of experiencing homelessness or housing instability
- Have a household income at or below 80 percent of the area median income
- Have a lack of assets and savings to pay rent arrears or current and future rent
- Be a Gloucester County resident
- Obligated to pay rent on a residential dwelling
