2023 BASIC HORTICULTURE SCHOOL & PESTICIDE RECERTIFICATION CLASSES

The Gloucester County Certified Gardeners are hosting Pesticide Recertification Classes starting this January announced Deputy Director Heather Simmons, liaison to the Certified Gardeners.

The sessions will provide participants with basic principles and recent advances relevant to the topics. Information is based on research from Land Grant Universities. Attendees will have an opportunity to acquire DEP pesticide credits indicated for selected classes.

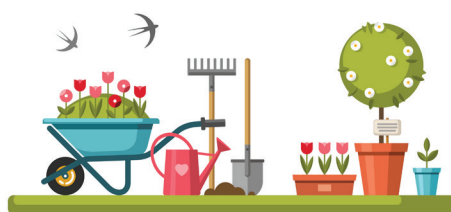
Classes include basic entomology, lawn & turf care, indoor plant maintenance, gardening for bees & pollinators and MUCH MORE!

Classes are recommended for professionals involved in: garden center sales and service; landscapers, managers of residential parks, schools and municipal grounds; golf

course superintendents, athletic field managers and other commercial horticulturists.

PAULSBORO MARINE TERMINAL PROJECT IN FULL SWING



The Gloucester County Improvement Authority (GCIA) has been the construction manager for the redevelopment of the Paulsboro Marine Terminal. This has been a multi-year process on behalf of the South Jersey Port Corporation with funding of over \$360m coming from the state. The site was targeted to serve the offshore wind industry and provide for living wage job creation and hundreds of millions in private investment. Currently, the wharf is being reconfigured to accommodate the large components going out to sea that will eventually be manufactured onsite. The GCIA has been at the forefront of making this project a reality from its inception. It is a major creator of economic development for not only our county but the state and the region as a whole.

DON'T MISS YOUR FLU SHOT

Annual vaccination is the best way to protect yourself against the flu. Vaccine flu viruses are chosen to maximize the likelihood that the influenza vaccine will protect against the viruses most likely to spread and cause illness among people during the upcoming flu season.

This year we will be offering ONLY quadrivalent seasonal flu vaccine that contains:
an A/Victoria/2570/2019 (H1N1)pdm09-like virus;
an A/Darwin/9/2021 (H3N2)-like virus;
a B/Austria/1359417/2021 (B/Victoria lineage)-like virus; and a B/Phuket/3073/2013 (B/Yamagata lineage)- like virus.
