## SCIENCE COMES ALIVE AT NATURE DETECTIVES CAMP

Nature Detectives camps immerse children in a fun and active nature camp experience, with both structured activities and time for unstructured, self-led downtime, and exploration. Each week's theme is explored through various art, activities, games, experiments, and observation each day, with opportunities to further delve into subjects and activities that campers will love. Each week includes a tour of our Nature Center, featuring live animals.

Please pack a reusable water bottle, sunblock and insect repellent, a hat, and a change of shoes and clothing.

The following sessions of Nature Detectives will be offered at Scotland Run Park in Clayton:

### July 10-14 (N-1)

For children entering 1st and 2nd grade

**Exploring Nature at Scotland** — Learn about nature at Scotland Run Park and Wilson Lake. What clues does nature leave for us? We'll use observations of sight and sound, along with technology, to help us identify local species. Campers will learn about the ecosystem through hands-on exploration. Get ready to hike the trails on our 1100 acre park and explore the banks of Wilson Lake.

### July 17 - July 21 (N-2)

For children entering 3rd and 4th grade

**SRP Eco Camp** — Learn about the ecosystems at Scotland Run Park and the creatures that live here, while hiking through the park. What role do native plants play in healthy habitat? What do our native animals need to survive in our changing world? What can we do to ensure the success of our natural world? Campers will use scientific inquiry to investigate ecosystems and develop a greater understanding of the interconnectedness of the natural world.

### July 24 - July 28 (N-3)

For children entering 5th through 8th grades

**Junior Scientists** — Learn how real-life scientists study the environment! Campers will run experiments, use scientific instruments, and collect their own data. See some of the projects that are in place at Scotland Run Park and interact with Rowan University Professors and other local science professionals. Get ready to hike and paddle across our 1100-acre nature park. (Three presentation days and two paddle days)

### July 31 - August 4 (N-4)

For children entering 1st through 4th grades

## DISCOVER THE STAGE AT SUMMER THEATER CAMP



Gloucester County's Summer Theater camps give children the opportunity to develop a basic understanding and appreciation of the performing arts. Instruction, games, exercises, and improvisation will be included, with an emphasis on acting skills. The directors will select the roles and every child will have the opportunity to perform, following workshops to prepare. Audience admittance to all performances is free.

This program is made possible in part by funding from The Gloucester County Cultural and Heritage Commission at Rowan College of South Jersey, a partner of the New Jersey State Council on the Arts/Department of State and the National Endowment for the Arts.

Children entering 3rd grade through 7th grade will be divided into two separate classes. One group will prepare and perform in an hour-long musical, the other in a shorter half-hour production. Each class includes five weeks of instruction and rehearsal, which will take place Monday through Friday from 9:00am to 12:00pm.

Junior high and high school students will prepare and perform a musical. The camp includes six weeks of instruction and rehearsal, which will take place Monday through Friday from 9:00am to 12:00pm.
