DiMarco, who serves as liaison to the Gloucester County Animal Shelter, has announced that a County "Microchip Mania!" event will take place on **Saturday, August 12 from 10:00am to 2:00pm** at the Animal Shelter, which is located at 1200 North Delsea Drive in Clayton.

The fee to have your pet microchipped is \$30, which can be paid in cash or with a debit or credit card. The Shelter respectfully asks that dogs not be on retractable leashes and strongly discourages body harnesses for this event.

SENIOR FARMERS MARKET



The State of New Jersey's "Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program" began on June 1, promoting nutritional health by providing access to locally-grown vegetables, fruits, and herbs to seniors. As part of this program, the Gloucester County Division of Senior Services will host "Summer Farmers Markets" at County nutrition centers this summer. Event dates and locations are as follows:

Seniors can apply onsite for benefits from the program at participating farmer's markets with assistance from our staff. Eligibility for the Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program is limited to those senior citizens who are 60 years and older and whose gross income (i.e., income before deductions for income taxes, Social Security taxes, insurance premiums, bonds, etc.) is equal to or less than the income poverty guidelines increased by 185%. Everyone attending these events will be able to choose from a wide selection of produce at a discounted rate, regardless of whether they qualify for benefits.

As part of each event, there will be a cooking demonstration showcasing healthy meal ideas and cooking techniques using these fresh fruits and vegetables.

ANNUAL CANDLELIGHT VIGIL TO RAISE OVERDOSE AWARENESS

Commissioner Jim Jefferson, liaison to the Division of Human & Special Services, has announced that the Gloucester County Addictions Task Force will host the County's 8th Annual Candlelight Vigil to raise awareness of overdoses on **Tuesday, August 29 at 7:00pm at Millennium Plaza at James G. Atkinson Park, located at 138 Bethel Mill Road in Sewell.** The rain date for the vigil is Wednesday, August 30.

The vigil is scheduled in close proximity to International Overdose Awareness Day, which is on August 31. This global awareness event is held annually to help raise awareness of overdoses and reduce the stigma of drug-related deaths. "Thousands of people from all walks of life die each year from drug-related causes," noted Commissioner Jefferson.

"Our vigil acknowledges the grief felt by families and friends and remembers those who have died or been permanently injured as a result of drug overdose"

GCEMS PERSONNEL HONORED


As a part of the recent observation of "EMS Week 2023", the surgeons at Crozer Regional Trauma Center in Upland, PA honored Gloucester County Emergency Medical Service (GCEMS) EMTs Emily DuBeau and Steve Paoline for the timely and lifesaving care they provided to a motor vehicle accident patient in Logan Township. As a direct result of the prehospital care provided by Emily and Steve along with Inspira Paramedics Sean Chandler and Steve Hubbs (and their collective teamwork), as well as the timely interventions and ongoing care provided at Crozer, the severely injured patient was discharged seven weeks after the accident to continue his recovery at home.

EMT TRAINING CLASS 7 GRADUATES



Gloucester County EMS' EMT Training Academy Class 7 recently completed didactic and clinical training. Commissioner Denice DiCarlo, liaison to Gloucester County Emergency Medical Service (GCEMS), was on hand for their graduation ceremony and addressed the graduates and their proud family members. Her remarks drove home the importance of the role that EMS plays. So far, seven of the graduates have successfully passed their National Registry of EMTs certification examination (on their first try!) and now hold National Registry and New Jersey EMT certifications. They will soon be assigned to GCEMS crews to complete their externships and transition into employees of the County of Gloucester and GCEMS.
