Preventing Elder Abuse

Vulnerable adults living in the community who are subjected to abuse, neglect, or exploitation and cannot fully protect or care for themselves can be serviced through Adult Protective Services.

Services could include home care, meals on wheels, health care, legal intervention, and case management to enable these vulnerable adults to live in a safe environment within the community. If you are aware of or suspect abuse of any kind, please call Gloucester County Adult Protective Services at **(856) 256-2113** between **8 a.m. - 4 p.m.**, or dial **211** twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. In cases of physical/sexual abuse and/or medical/mental health crisis emergency, **911** should be called immediately.



What is Adult Protective Services?

Adult Protective Services (APS) programs have been established in each county in New Jersey to receive and investigate reports of suspected abuse, neglect and exploitation of vulnerable adults living in a community setting.

The Purpose of APS:

Stabilize a crisis situation using the least intrusive methods while respecting an individual's right to self-determination.

Making a Referral to APS:

The referral should be made by the person with first-hand information about the client. The referral should be made directly to the county in which the client resides. The referral should consist of as much information as possible including:

- Client's name, address, phone number
- DOB and Social Security number
- Diagnoses - health and/or mental health issues
- Family members/support systems (services/agencies involved)
- A specific allegation of abuse, neglect or exploitation

CONFIDENTIALITY

All records and communications pertaining to any report, evaluation or service provided pursuant to the Adult Protective Services Act (P.L. 1993, Ch. 249, C52:27D) are confidential.

APS is only permitted to share the results of an APS assessment when directed to do so by a court of competent jurisdiction or when disclosure of information is necessary for the Division or the APS provider to perform its responsibilities as set forth by statute.

APS Cases

APS may become involved in situations that meet all of these conditions:

A vulnerable adult is:

- Age 18 years or older, AND
- Residing in the community, AND
- Due to physical or mental illness, disability or deficiency, lacks sufficient understanding or capacity to make, communicate, or carry out decisions concerning his or her well-being, AND
- Is the subject of abuse, neglect or exploitation.

Low Cost Spay/Neuter Program

You may be eligible to have your pet spayed or neutered at a discounted price. Many people want to have their pets spayed or neutered, but due to the costs associated, think it won't be possible. But there are many veterinarians and organizations who are ready and able to help. Spay or neuter your dog or cat for \$10.00 if you receive any of the following: Food Stamps, Medicaid, General Public Assistance, Rental Assistance, Lifeline Utility Credit, Tenants Lifeline Assistance, SSI, or PAAD. Every year many cats and dogs end up in animal shelters. Spaying and neutering helps to prevent pet overpopulation, and decreases the number of animals that end up in shelters. Seasonal Flu Clinics

The CDC recommends that seniors get their seasonal flu shot annually. Every fall, influenza vaccinations are available at no cost to Gloucester County residents at scheduled locations throughout the county. The flu clinic schedule is published in the County newsletter, announced in the local newspaper, and is available on the Gloucester County website at **www.gloucestercountynj.gov**. Schedule copies are available at the Division of Senior Services and all Nutrition Sites. Information is also known by calling the Gloucester County Health Department at **(856) 218-4101**. Eligibility restrictions and supply availability may apply.

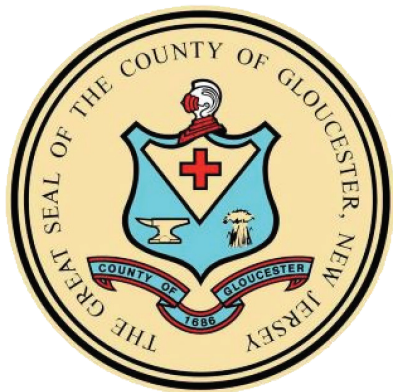
Free Eye Screenings

The Gloucester County Division of Human & Special Services and the New Jersey Commission for the Blind offers free eye screenings open to the public (ages 4 and up), held once a month, and there is no income requirement. The screenings are held at the Gloucester County Health Department, 204 East Holly Avenue in Sewell.

Glaucoma tests are also offered.
