## Free Health Screenings and Information

The Gloucester County Department of Health provides the free health screenings and information at the Gloucester County Store, located in the Deptford Mall, on the first Friday of each month from 10:00 a.m. -12:00 p.m. Screenings include:

### Blood Pressure

The early detection of heart disease can be achieved by monitoring blood pressure regularly. A regular blood pressure check could also detect any abnormalities in the levels. Early detection is essential for reducing the risk of heart attacks and strokes.

### Glucose & Cholesterol Testing

Tests for cholesterol and diabetes should be done every 1–2 years, depending on risk factors for people over 50. Screening regularly ensures heart health and overall well-being.

# Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) helps low-income families and individuals meet home heating and medically necessary cooling costs. This year, the application period is **October 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025.**

To apply for LIHEAP, you can visit [www.energyassistance.nj.gov](http://www.energyassistance.nj.gov) or contact an authorized local community action agency, community-based organization or outreach agency in your county for assistance. Persons over 60 or disabled may receive and return applications by mail or request a home visit from an outreach agency in their county.

In addition, the Division of Senior Services can provide assistance. Applicants for LIHEAP benefits must be responsible for heating or cooling costs, either directly or included in their rent; and have gross income at or below 60% of the state median income. Persons who live in public housing and/or receive rental assistance are not eligible for assistance, unless they pay for their own heating costs directly to the fuel supplier. LIHEAP heating benefit amount is determined by income, household size, fuel type, and heating region.

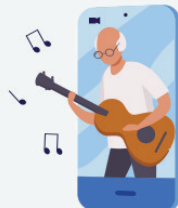
## Free Virtual Classes for Older Adults

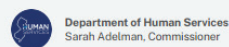

## Seniors for Seniors



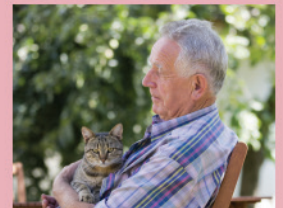
Gloucester County Animal Shelter in conjunction with the Gloucester County Division of Senior Services would like to help our senior citizens adopt a senior cat in need!
