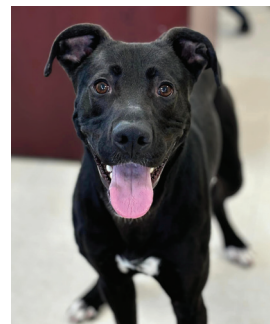

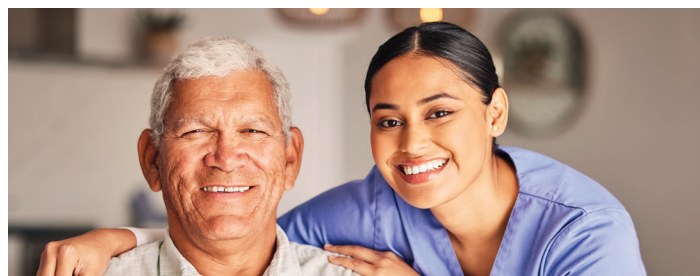


NATIONAL FAMILY CAREGIVERS MONTH

HOW GREEN IS YOUR THUMB?



The Gloucester County Certified Gardener Program is a county facilitated program in which residents receive horticulture training and in exchange provide volunteer service to the county

through a variety of venues. Certified Gardeners are trained volunteers who assist Gloucester County in delivering horticulture programs and information to the general public. Volunteer opportunities also include our Certified Gardener Helpline, staffing information booths at community events, helping with gardening demonstrations and classes, as well as community beautification efforts. Anyone interested in gardening and a commitment to volunteer service can become a Certified Gardener. No previous education or training in horticulture is necessary.

The training program runs from January through May, but applications are accepted year-round.

NEW ID LAW COMING IN 2025

State law will soon require REAL ID cards, or an equivalent document, if you want to fly in the United States. The deadline for the new federally-approved driver's license was recently moved to May 7, 2025, allowing several months for residents who are planning to take to the air next year.

To get a REAL ID in New Jersey, you must bring two proofs of residential address, one proof of Social Security Number, and six points of ID (a U.S. Passport or birth certificate counts for four points; one-point forms of ID include a high school diploma, social security card, bank/credit union statement, debit card, property tax statement, etc).

COVID-19 backlogs in state agencies charged with issuing driver's licenses and identification cards prompted the last REAL ID extension in late 2022. The original 2020 deadline to get REAL IDs had been extended multiple times because of the pandemic.

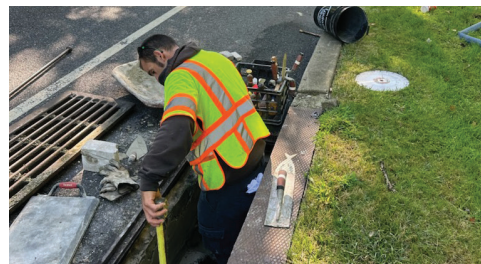

FIVE PET SAFETY TIPS FOR THANKSGIVING

You may be tempted to give your pets some of your Thanksgiving feast, but many treats we love can make our pets ill.

Keep your pet safe with these five tips:

1. Don't feed your pet turkey. Turkey is high in fat, so even small pieces can cause pancreatitis, especially in smaller pets.
2. Keep wine glasses higher than snout and tail level! Alcohol can cause pets' blood sugar and pressure to drop dangerously.
3. Baking chocolate is even more toxic than regular chocolate as it contains higher amounts of caffeine and theobromine. But no matter what sweet treats you're baking, keep nosy snouts out of the kitchen.
4. Hide the bread dough. The stomach provides a warm environment for yeast to produce ethanol, so when bread dough is swallowed, it continues to expand, causing ethanol toxicosis.
5. Whether you are bringing your pets with you or boarding them, check their chips before you leave for vacation. Microchips help your pets get home safe if they do get lost.

HOMEBUYER DOWN PAYMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Homebuyer Down Payment Assistance Program is intended as a means of stabilizing property values and overall quality of life in targeted neighborhoods throughout the County. The major objective is to increase the supply of affordable housing for low and moderate income families. The goal of this program is to help Gloucester County residents achieve their dream of homeownership.

By providing assistance with down payment and closing costs, Gloucester County enables low-income applicants to qualify for a mortgage in addition to:

Increase the supply of affordable housing for families for an extended period of time.

Stabilize property values and create a balance between rental and ownership housing stock in certain neighborhoods.

Help renters who have steady incomes but cannot make the leap to ownership because they lack the needed lump sum to cover closing and down payment costs.

Eligible Borrowers

Any low to moderate income household that does not exceed 80% the median income adjusted for family size at the time of purchase may be considered for this program. A household is classified as all persons living in the home regardless of blood relation, marriage or other circumstance. Other eligibility criteria include:

Any low to moderate income household that has not owned a home in the past three years (except with issues related to health, safety and welfare of a family as reviewed on a case-by-case basis, i.e., displaced homemakers and loss of primary residence due to natural disaster).

Minimum 3% personal financial investment

The applicant must complete a minimum of an eight hour Housing and Urban Development (HUD) approved Home Buyer Education course. See link below to find a HUD approved counselor /agency.

Eligible Properties

HOME funds may be used for one-to-four-unit properties that are previously or publicly owned. A variety of housing types are eligible, including:

Condominium units in a single-family or multifamily building

Manufactured housing on permanent foundation where a deed for the land is to be recorded.

Single-family (one unit) homes

The unit must be located within one of the 24 municipalities of Gloucester County to be eligible.



The unit cannot exceed the maximum sales price as determined by HUD.

Assistance through this program provides 0% deferred payment loans up to \$25,000 as required through underwriting that will be applied first to closing costs and the balance to down-payment assistance. A mortgage and Deed Restriction will be placed on the acquired property. The restriction on affordability is determined by subsidy provided in accordance with HUD regulations. Repayment of funds is based on the affordability period.

Full payment of the County funds is required should the household sell, transfer, refinance, obtain a reverse mortgage or utilize any vehicle to obtain cash against the equity of the property within the initial affordability period (can range from 5-10 years).

There is an extended period of affordability where 1/5 of the affordability subsidy will be forgiven for the next 4 year period.

The County will require 1/5 repayment should the owner transfer, sell, refinance obtain a reverse mortgage or utilize any vehicle to obtain cash against the equity of the property.

Further explanation of these criteria are outlined in the application and policy manual. You must contact the office prior to executing a sales agreement to ensure availability of funds and reasonable time for review in order to align with an anticipated settlement date. Failure to communicate with this office may impact required processing time to accommodate your closing date.

HOLIDAY TIPS FOR FAMILIES OF SUBSTANCE USERS

For many families, the holidays can be a time of tension, strife, and overindulgent behavior. This stress can be particularly severe for families of substance users. For these families, the thought of managing substance abuse issues while maintaining peace and unity can be overwhelming — and mishandling these issues can lead to further estrangement from the substance user or a relapse for the recovering person.

The Gloucester County Division of Human Services wants to remind families to set boundaries that are simple, clear and doable, and that must be adhered to in order to participate in family festivities. This of course includes being clean and sober.
