In recognition of National Lost Pet Prevention Month, Commissioner Director Frank J. DiMarco is reminding residents about the simple steps that can make all the difference in reuniting with a missing pet. Whether it's securing an ID tag, microchipping, or quickly alerting neighbors and shelters, proactive identification is key.

The Gloucester County Animal Shelter's Animal Control Division is on hand to help with lost and found pet calls, as well as redemptions. They are open Monday–Thursday, 8am–6pm, and Friday–Saturday, 8am–4pm. Residents are encouraged to stop by or call immediately if they've lost or found a pet.

STAY SAFE IN JULY'S HEAT WITH THESE SIMPLE TIPS

July's heat can be tough, especially for seniors. Here are key tips to stay healthy and safe during the hot summer months:

- **Stay Hydrated:** Drink at least 8 glasses of water or hydrating drinks daily.
- **Avoid Heat Exposure:** Stay indoors between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., especially in air-conditioned spaces.
- **Dress Appropriately:** Wear loose, light-colored clothing and a wide-brimmed hat for sun protection.
- **Use Sunscreen:** Apply SPF 30 or higher before going outside and reapply often.
- **Be Aware of Medications:** Check with your doctor about any heat-related concerns with your meds.
- **Know the Signs of Heat Illness:** Seek help immediately if you feel confused, tired, or dizzy.
