APPLY GLOUCESTER COUNTY MILITARY SERVICE MEDAL

The Gloucester County Office of Veterans Affairs, under the oversight of Commissioner Director Frank DiMarco and Liaison Commissioner Tom Bianco, invites local Veterans to apply for the Gloucester County Military Service Medal, which will be presented at the next county ceremony honoring our heroes. Applications are available at the Office of Veterans Affairs (211 County House Rd, Sewell), or online at gloucestercountynj.gov267/Veterans-Affairs. Applicants must include a copy of their Honorable Discharge (such as DD214, NGB 22, or equivalent).

Family members may also apply on behalf of a deceased Veteran by submitting the discharge papers and death certificate. Eligible recipients must be Gloucester County residents or have entered service from Gloucester County. Applications can be mailed to the Office of Veterans Affairs, P.O. Box 337, Woodbury, NJ 08096, or dropped off in person at the Sewell office.

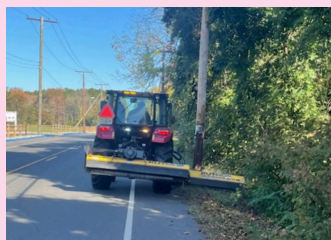
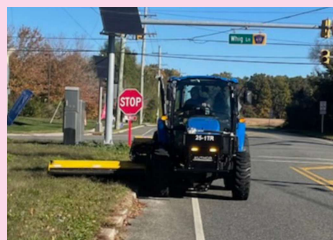
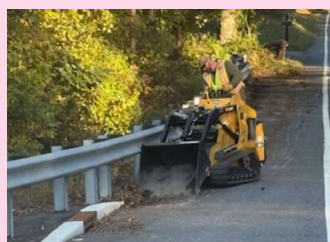
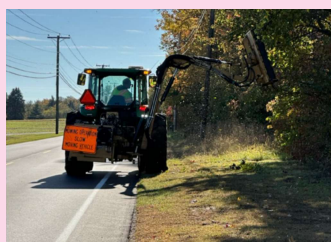
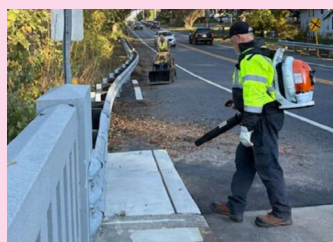

WHAT TO DO IF YOU FIND AN INJURED ANIMAL



If you come across an animal that has been hit by a car, the Gloucester County Animal Shelter reminds residents to stay calm and put safety first. For domestic pets, approach cautiously, check for ID tags, and, if necessary, move the animal gently using a blanket or towel. Take the pet to the nearest veterinary hospital and notify local animal control or the shelter.

For wild animals, never attempt to handle them directly. Call Animal Control, a local wildlife rehabilitation center, or police if the animal is in the roadway. Keep a safe distance and mark the location so rescuers can respond quickly.

FREE MONTHLY HEALTH SCREENINGS AT DEPTFORD MALL

The Gloucester County Department of Health also offers free health screenings and wellness information on the **first Friday of every month from 10:00 AM—12:00 PM** in front of the Gloucester County Store at the Deptford Mall.

SCREENINGS INCLUDE:

- **Blood Pressure:** Regular monitoring helps with early detection of heart disease.
- **Glucose & Cholesterol Testing:** Adults over 50 should be screened every 1–2 years, depending on risk factors.

The next screening will take place **December 5**. Be sure to consult your healthcare provider to determine which screenings are right for you.



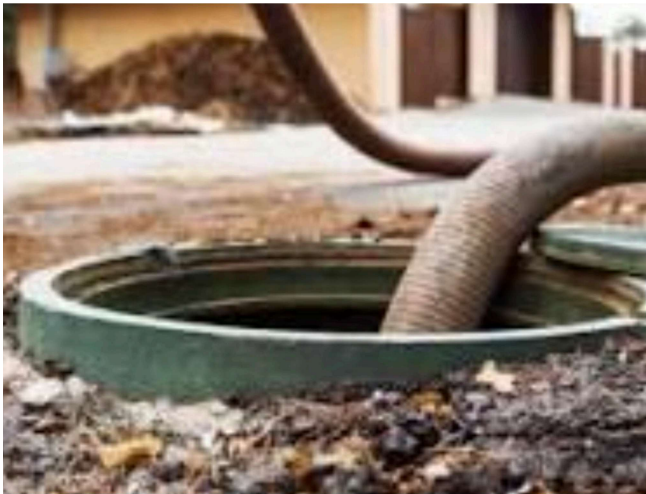
