The Gloucester County Division of Transportation Services (DTS), under the oversight of liaison Deputy Director Jim Jefferson, is celebrating a major milestone: 40 years of providing dependable, non-emergency curb-to-curb transportation for seniors, individuals with disabilities, veterans, and low-income residents.

Since 1985, DTS has supported mobility and independence across the county, delivering millions of rides and helping residents access essential appointments and services. As part of its continued commitment to safe and reliable transportation, DTS has added a new 2025 Ford van to its fleet, which will be used for non-emergency medical trips.

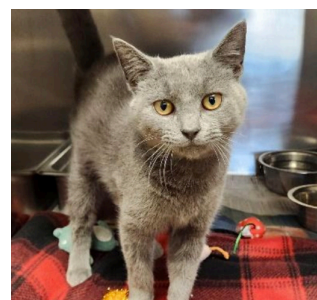
RING IN THE NEW YEAR WITH A NEW PET!

January is the perfect time for new beginnings, and the Gloucester County Animal Shelter, under the oversight of Commissioner Director Frank J. DiMarco, has many cats and dogs ready for adoption. All pets are spayed or neutered, microchipped, wormed, and have age-appropriate vaccinations. Dogs receive a heartworm test and bordetella, and cats are FELV/FIV tested.

Adoption fees are \$125 for dogs and \$95 for cats, with reduced fees of \$35 for seniors (62+) and military veterans. Pets 6 years or older have their adoption fee waived.

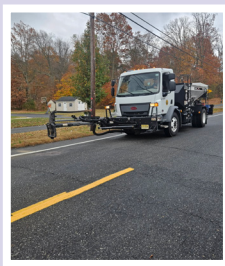
