The Gloucester County WIC Program promotes the health of women, infants, and young children by providing nutrition assistance, education, and access to essential health services.



About WIC

WIC serves pregnant, breastfeeding, and postpartum women, as well as infants and children under age five. Services include nutrition and breastfeeding education, basic health screenings, referrals to health and social services, and access to healthy supplemental foods.

Eligibility

New Jersey residents who are pregnant, breastfeeding, postpartum, or have a child under five may qualify. Families receiving Medicaid, SNAP, or TANF, or who meet income guidelines, are encouraged to apply.
